



The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority has **CANCELLED** the **FLOOD WATCH** issued on the 13<sup>th</sup> of May 2017 effective immediately, 17 May 2017.

Levels and flows have decreased significantly from the recent highs experienced during the Flood Watch period from the 13<sup>th</sup> to the 17<sup>th</sup> of May 2017. Current levels and flows will continue to decrease or stabilize at or near seasonal norms for this time of year. Forecasted weather is very warm and dry over the next 48 hours and future rainfall is not expected to negatively impact the watershed.

ALTHOUGH LEVELS AND FLOWS ARE RECEDING, THE CVCA CONTINUES TO URGE EVERYONE, ESPECIALLY CHILDREN TO STAY AWAY FROM ALL DAMS, WEIRS, HYDRO GENERATING PLANTS, BRIDGES AND ALL WATERCOURSES. CURRENT FLOWS IN RIVERS AND LARGER STREAMS OR CREEKS CAN STILL EASILY SWEEP PEOPLE INTO A DANGEROUS SITUATION CAUSING HARM OR DROWNING ACCIDENTS.
