



The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority has issued the following **FLOOD WARNING UPDATE** effective immediately, **3:00 PM, 23 April 2019**.

FLOOD WARNING UPDATE

This FLOOD WARNING update is issued for the entire Crowe Valley watershed.

Areas specifically experiencing flooding or the potential for serious flooding to continue include:

- 1) The Crowe River from Cordova Lake south through the Village of Marmora until the Crowe empties into the Trent River. Cameron Street in Marmora is partially flooded. Crowe River flows are currently recorded at 216 cubic metres per second with flows are expected to slowly trend upward for the next 24 hours.
- 2) Beaver Creek in the Marmora area from Fidar's Rapids to the mouth of Beaver Creek. Beaver Creek has levelled off and is beginning to recede very slowly.
- 3) The following lakes continue to slowly rise throughout the day or have started to show signs of stabilizing: St. Ola, Cordova Lake, Belmont Lake and Crowe Lake.
- 4) Wollaston Lake, Round Lake, Kasshabog Lake, Chandos Lake and Paudash Lake have been stable, crested or receded slightly from their peaks in the past 24 hours.

This current situation is expected to continue for the next 24 hours. However, forecasted precipitation this afternoon and tonight may have an impact on the watershed if amount of rainfall received exceeds predicted totals.

Municipalities, emergency services and individuals in flood prone areas should remain prepared in these areas to deal with current or any future flooding issues.

THE CVCA CONTINUES TO URGE EVERYONE, ESPECIALLY CHILDREN TO STAY AWAY FROM ALL DAMS, WEIRS, HYDRO GENERATING PLANTS, BRIDGES AND CULVERTS. SPRINGTIME CONDITIONS ON WATERCOURSES CAN EASILY CREATE DANGEROUS SITUATIONS CAUSING HARM OR DROWNING ACCIDENTS LEADING TO FATALITIES. STAY AWAY FROM ICE COVERED SURFACES, DITCHES AND TRIBUTARIES.

CVCA staff will continue to monitor levels and flows daily and this **Flood Warning** will be updated THURSDAY 25TH of April or as conditions warrant.
