



The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority is issuing the following **FLOOD WATCH** effective immediately, **8 April 2023 at 10:30 am**. and will remain in effect until 11 April 2023 unless updated prior to this date and time.

## FLOOD WATCH

Water levels and flows throughout the Crowe Valley watershed have slowly showed signs of peaking from the precipitation received last week. Although a significant snowpack continues to melt and provide additional input into the watershed, it currently is not enough to sustain the high water levels and flows experienced in the past 24 hours. Therefore, the entire watershed **should** peak in the next 24 hours if forecasted weather conditions remain in effect. Lakes such as Belmont and Crowe and the lower portion of Crowe River from Marmora to the Trent Severn system will be the last to peak.

The **FLOOD WATCH** for the entire watershed will remain in effect as above average day and night time temperatures are forecasted in the next 7 day period beginning on the 10<sup>th</sup> of April. These weather conditions will accelerate the melting of the snowpack and contribute to the watershed. This impact will likely slow the rate of decline from the high water levels and flows experienced in the past 48 hours, which will extend the spring freshet period.

Municipalities, emergency services and individuals in flood prone areas should continue to be vigilant and prepared to take the necessary steps to contend with the current situation. Unexpected events such as beaver dams failing could easily create isolated pockets of flooding or washout roads.

In addition to the flooding hazard, ice on lakes will continue to deteriorate, however, no ice jams causing flooding are reported at this time.

CVCA staff will continue to monitor levels and flows daily and this **Flood Watch** will be updated daily or as conditions warrant.
