#### **Summary of Committee Functions**

- Oversee a science-based planning process to protect municipal drinking water sources in the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region
- Guide the implementation of the Trent and Ganaraska source protection plans, amendments to the plans, the plan policies, assessment reports, and other source protection work in accordance with the *Clean Water Act, 2006* and its regulations

#### **Source Protection Committee Member Obligations**

The following requirements are set out in the regulation:

• Members **must** reside in, own or rent property in, be employed or operate a business in, or be employed by a municipality that is located within the boundaries of the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region

- Members cannot be a current board or staff member of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority, Kawartha Conservation, Otonabee Region Conservation Authority, Crowe Valley Conservation Authority or the Lower Trent Region Conservation Authority
- Once appointed, members must regularly attend Source Protection Committee meetings and comply with the committee's code of conduct (available in the Committee Handbook available on our website at: <u>http://trentsourceprotection.on.ca/source-protection-committee/what-isthe-source-protection-committee</u>)

# SPC members should be willing and able to:

- Contribute positively to the development of amendments to the technical assessment report and the source protection plans, and oversee their implementation
- Attend meetings day or evening, normally two to four meetings annually
- Make a long-term time commitment to participate (ideally five years)
- Review and understand scientific and technical reports
- Prepare for meetings by reviewing agendas and reports in advance of the meeting
- Attend training sessions, participate at public meetings and event, and open houses on occasion
- Act as a liaison for the interest(s) you are representing (bring commonly held opinions to the committee table and communicate the committee's work back to your sector)
- Work with others collaboratively to solve problems and make decisions at the committee table
- Respect confidential information and abide by the process in place to safeguard confidential information

# **Member Qualifications**

The Source Protection Authorities will consider the following when making appointments to the Source Protection Committee:

- Proven ability to act as a liaison for the interest(s) being represented
- Excellent problem-solving, analytical, communication and organizational skills
- Knowledge of local watersheds, communities and issues
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with groups and in a team environment
- Willingness to work with representatives from other sectors and interests
- Willingness and ability to travel within the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region

# Compensation

- Per diem and expenses (mileage) for Source Protection Committee meetings.
- Per diem and mileage for representing the SPC at outreach opportunities such as public events and meetings (with prior approval).

  - 3. Your interest in the position you are applying for.
  - 4. Your experiences working effectively on multi-stakeholder teams or in groups responsible for making decisions.
