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#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Throughout the existence of the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority (CVCA), the Authority has been actively involved in water management and in particular, flood forecasting and warning. The Authority has installed 13 stream and lake level gauges to date, to monitor real time conditions in the watershed. As well, information related to flood forecasting is received from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry in Peterborough, Ontario. The Authority also monitors precipitation, snow pack and advancing weather conditions.

Following severe flooding in 1976, flood plain mapping was produced and many areas that are susceptible to flood damage were identified.

# The Authority is responsible for advanced warning and monitoring of flood situations; the individual municipalities are responsible for reacting to flood emergencies.

#### 2.0 OBJECTIVES OF CVCA FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM

- To provide advice to local municipalities, the public and emergency response services regarding potential flooding, and to provide rapid warning if loss of life, injury or property damage may result.
- To provide continuous monitoring of flood conditions should a flood occur.

#### 3.0 MANDATE OF THE CVCA

In the publication, "Planning for Flood Emergencies" prepared by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry, it states that:

"It will be a function of Conservation Authorities to maintain a flood warning system throughout the Authority for alerting municipal representatives, media, local police, the Ontario Provincial Police, and the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry."

#### 4.0 DAILY OPERATING PROCEDURES

#### 4.1 Procedures for Recording Daily Water Levels

The CVCA, on a daily basis, obtains water levels, flow rates and precipitation data from gauges throughout the watershed of the Crowe River system. In normal water conditions, these gauges are contacted a minimum of once per day, seven days a week. During flooding conditions, the gauges provide real time water levels and flow data as required.

The information obtained is compiled into a log book by the Duty Forecaster (see **Appendix 1**). The Duty Forecaster analyses the data and determines what, if any, further actions are required. These actions may consist of stop log adjustments being made at any or all of the individual dams under the Authority's jurisdiction. Further actions may be the issuance of watershed conditions or flood watch statements in extreme conditions; a flood warning will be issued to all parties listed in the CVCA'S Flood/Emergency Contact List.

The daily schedule for the Duty Forecaster is as follows:

- (1) Collect all the water levels, flow volumes, precipitation and temperatures throughout the watershed.
- (2) The Duty Forecaster will then contact the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry for Provincial weather conditions which may impact the CVCA watershed. Additional information may be received from the Provincial Surface Water Monitoring Centre.
- (3) With this data in hand, the Duty Forecaster will make a decision whether there is a need for stop log changes, or the issuance of a flood watch or flood warning statements.
- (4) Should the Duty Forecaster determine a flood watch or flood warning is necessary, he/she will advise both the General Manager and the Chair of the Authority that the agencies listed in the Flood/Emergency Contact List will be notified. Contact will be made by fax, e-mail or telephone, as the situation warrants.
- (5) Should no changes to log settings or bulletins be needed, the Duty Forecaster will continue with his/her regular daily duties; however, he/she will continue to monitor all incoming information and data throughout the remainder of the day.

#### 4.2 Monthly Water Level Reports

For reference purposes, daily records are summarized into a "Monthly Water Level Report" which is distributed to member municipalities and other interested parties on a regular basis. This report indicates regulated winter and summer lake levels, minimum and maximum levels as well as the level on the last day of each month for each controlled lake and gauge site in the Crowe River Watershed. See **Appendix 2**.

### 5.0 RESPONSE TO FLOOD WARNING

It must be noted and understood that the responsibility to respond to a flood warning is that of the Municipality concerned. The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority will act in an *advisory capacity* but will not be responsible for flood fighting.

#### 6.0 FLOODING REPORTED TO A MUNICIPALITY

If an incidence of flooding is reported to a Municipality, by anyone other than the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority (CVCA), the Municipality concerned will immediately contact the CVCA for confirmation and/or additional information. The CVCA will then revise and update its forecast accordingly and continue to monitor the reported flooding.

#### 7.0 OFFICE HOURS DURING AN EMERGENCY

If a flood warning bulletin is about to be issued, the CVCA office will be staffed on a 24-hour basis from that moment. This will continue until the emergency has passed.

#### 8.0 EMERGENCY SITUATIONS

A CVCA staff person will be "on call" during off hours and weekends. *In an emergency situation only,* this person can be contacted via telephone at 613-848-2478. For a list of key CVCA contacts, refer to Section **12.1 Crowe Valley Conservation Authority** of this plan.

#### 9.0 AMATEUR RADIO EMERGENCY SERVICE

The Quinte Amateur Radio Club, established under the auspices of The Radio Amateurs of Canada, has installed an antenna at the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority Administration Office in Marmora which can be utilized in an emergency situation.

The Radio Club can cover all Hospitals, Conservation Authorities, Town and City Halls, Police Stations, Red Cross offices and other sites as required. They are also able to make direct contact with any Government office in Toronto. Their mobile units are able to go to any site as required.

Please refer to **Appendix 3** for contact information.

#### 10.0 FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM

The flood warning system of the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority will involve four basic areas of activity:

- 1) data collection and assessment;
- 2) issuing of statements;
- 3) assisting in the preparation of municipal flood contingency plans; and
- 4) regular review and updating of the system.

#### **10.1 Data Collection and Assessment**

The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority will be responsible for the collection of all data necessary to prepare appropriate messages regarding flooding. The collection of data and issuing of statements will be carried out at the CVCA Administration Office in Marmora.

#### **10.2** Issuing of Watershed Messages

On completing an assessment of pertinent data, the Duty Forecaster will review it with the General Manager and an appropriate statement will be issued. Messages be one of four types, i.e.: (Water Safety or Flood Outlook) 1) normal, 2) watershed conditions (water safety or flood outlook), 3) flood watch or 4) flood warning. The Authority Chair will be advised immediately when a flood watch or flood warning message has been issued.

Communication of messages will normally be made by telephone, email and/or fax. However, information sheets regarding snow pack, lake levels and flows may also be circulated on an "as needed" basis.

All messages must be updated regularly and a final watershed conditions statement indicating that a crisis has ended must be issued.

#### **10.2.1** Flood Watch Messages

Flood watch statements will be issued to Municipal Flood Co-ordinators when conditions are such that it may be necessary to implement a local flood contingency plan. Flood watch messages will not require action by the Municipal Flood Co-ordinator, i.e.: mobilization of manpower and equipment. They may, however, require a state of readiness to act.

#### 10.2.2 Flood Warning Messages

Flood warning messages will be issued to all parties on the distribution list when conditions are such that public safety is at risk and property damage is likely to occur. Please refer to **Appendix 5.** Flood warning messages will require action from the Local Response Co-ordinator, i.e.: implementation of the local flood contingency plan.

# 10.3 Regular Review and Updating of the CVCA Flood Warning System

The CVCA Flood Warning Plan is reviewed and updated on a yearly or "as needed" basis. Agencies included in the mailing list are asked to notify the CVCA of any changes required. The CVCA will, in the early part of each year, issue current plans.

# **10.4** Assisting in the Preparation of Municipal Flood Contingency Plans

In order for Municipalities to carry out their responsibility to respond to flood emergencies, each Municipality should have at least a basic flood contingency plan. Assistance in preparation of contingency plans is available from the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority.

Municipalities are encouraged to maintain an adequate supply of sandbags on hand at all times and be prepared to supply sand also on an "as needed" basis.







# **APPENDIX 9 – BACKGROUND AND SITUATION ANALYSIS**

#### 1.0

The Allan Mills Dam, which is owned and operated by the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority, is located in Part of Lot 26, Concession 12, Seymour Township. The dam is located approximately 10 kilometers downstream of the Village of Marmora and approximately 6 kilometers above the outlet of the Crowe River into the Trent River system. The dam, with a 64-meter overflow weir and three operating sluice gates, maintains water levels on a wide section of the Crowe River named Rylstone Lake upstream to a small waterfall known as Callaghan's Rapids.

Immediately upstream of the dam is a bridge owned jointly by Hastings County and Northumberland County. The river through this area varies in width and in steepness of the riverbank. A small number of seasonal and permanent residences are located along the banks of the river between the dam and Callaghan's Rapids. In general, the lowest lying residences are located immediately upstream of the bridge.

The Crowe River watershed above Allan Mills Dam drains an area of approximately 2000 Km<sup>2</sup>. The flow of the river in this section varies from under 2 cubic meters per second (cms) in summer to a 1:100 year flow in excess of 225 cms. During the spring of 1998 the river peaked at a flow of 194 cms. Recently, in 2019, the river peaked at a flow of 227 cms.

This appendix has been prepared in response to concerns that the ice jamming <u>may</u> cause flooding due to shifting and jamming in downstream narrows, the bridge or the dam. In the event of flooding resulting from ice jams, this Authority's Flood Contingency Plan will be used as a guideline for flood watch, flood warning and flood response. Given that flooding, resulting from ice jamming, may affect residents in the Municipality of Trent Hills or the Township of Stirling-Rawdon, both municipalities will take a joint leadership role in flood response. Access to some of the property that may be affected will be through Marmora and Lake Township and as a result they are included as participants in this plan in a support role.

This appendix assumes that, if flooding does occur as a result of ice jamming, the response time for action will be extremely short. The first point of this plan will be the safe evacuation of residents at risk of flooding.

# 2.0 <u>Purpose</u>

This plan has been prepared as an Appendix to the Emergency Plans of the affected Municipalities and the annual Crowe Valley Conservation Authority Flood Contingency Plan. It is intended to form part of the local emergency planning process in the event that a flood emergency occurs as a result of a ice jamming during periods of high water. The plan is intended to prepare for the most efficient deployment of all services and resources in the event that ice jamming blocks the flow of water and causes localized flooding. This plan is intended to ensure:

- 2.1 an efficient flood monitoring system
- 2.2 the earliest possible response to an emergency with the resources available and the establishment of overall control of emergency operations
- 2.3 a response consistent with the prevailing conditions and information provided by the Conservation Authority flood warning system or other sources
- 2.4 crowd control to maintain order so that emergency operations are not impeded and to eliminate sources of potential danger in flood areas
- 2.5 policing to protect property and prevent looting
- 2.6 controlled evacuation and relocation of people considered to be in a hazardous situation
- 2.7 rescue of persons with minimum delay and provision of medical aid
- 2.8 salvage of property
- 2.9 orderly re-occupations of premises

## 3.0 <u>Revisions</u>

This plan will be revised as long as the threat of flooding from ice jamming remains or as conditions change.

# 4.0 <u>Responsibilities</u>

In general terms the responsibilities of the primary agencies involved in this plan are given below.

#### 4.1 Crowe Valley Conservation Authority – Duty Forecaster

The responsibilities of the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority – Duty Forecaster will include:

- 4.1.1 daily monitoring of climatic conditions, water conditions and flood forecasting predictions
- 4.1.2 providing Flood Watch and Flood Warning Statements as required by the plan
- 4.1.3 acting as the initial media contact

- 4.1.4 acting as the liaison with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry regarding Provincial Flood Alerts and environmental issues
- 4.1.5 acting as the liaison with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans regarding potential implications of the *Federal Fisheries Act*

#### 4.2 Lead Municipalities & Municipal Flood Coordinators Municipality of Trent Hills & Township of Stirling-Rawdon

Due to the potential for flooding to cross municipal boundaries it has been agreed that the Municipality of Trent Hills and the Township of Stirling-Rawdon will assume joint responsibility for flood response. As a recommendation, each Municipality will appoint a Flood Coordinator whose responsibilities will include:

- 4.2.1 providing the coordination and deployment of all resources required to respond to flooding
- 4.2.2 acting as the coordinating agency for determining persons and properties at risk (in consultation with the Ontario Provincial Police and the Conservation Authority)
- 4.2.3 acting as the coordinating agency for the orderly and timely evacuation of residents (in consultation with the Ontario Provincial Police)
- 4.2.4 providing temporary shelter for persons evacuated
- 4.2.5 acting as the coordinating agency for securing property (in consultation with the Ontario Provincial Police)
- 4.2.6 providing sandbags, sands and manpower assistance to land owners (Note: opportunities for sand bagging may be limited due to time constraints and/or manpower constraints and will take a secondary role to preventing loss of life) at the Municipalities discretion
- 4.2.7 acting as the coordinating agency for the relocation of evacuated residents
- 4.2.8 providing cleanup of flood debris and damage on municipally owned land and at the discretion of the municipality, provide cleanup assistance for citizens
- 4.2.9 acting as the Chair for regular Flood Coordinating Meetings
- 4.2.10 declaration of municipal emergency (in consultation with the Ontario Provincial Police and the Conservation Authority)
- 4.2.11 determining if local resources are adequate or if additional resources are required

#### 4.4 Ontario Provincial Police

The responsibilities of the Ontario Provincial Police will include:

- 4.4.1 the coordination of all security aspects relating to the flood such as road closures, vandalism, looting and crowd control
- 4.4.2 acting as a media spokesperson during the flood event (in consultation with the Municipalities and the Conservation Authority)
- 4.4.3 consulting with the Municipalities with respect to the declaration of an emergency

#### 4.5 Support Municipality Township of Marmora and Lake

The responsibility of the Support Municipality – Township of Marmora and Lake, will include:

- 4.5.1 manpower and equipment support to be directed by the Lead Municipalities
- 4.5.2 support to the lead Municipalities with respect to access and control issue for residents that access their property through Marmora and Lake Township
- 4.5.3 shelter support for evacuated residents

# 5.0 <u>Flood Monitoring Plan</u>

Attached, Schedule 'B', is a copy of the Flood Monitoring Plan. The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority will be responsible for the flood monitoring section of this plan.

For the purpose of this plan, Flood Monitoring has been divided into two distinct stages. The first stage, Routine Daily Monitoring will be used at all times when the flow in the Crowe River is <u>less</u> than 150 cms as recorded at the Crowe River – Marmora Flow Gauge and will consist of the following:

- 5.1 minimum once daily contract with Environment Canada (Weather)
- 5.2 minimum once daily reading of Marmora (Crowe River) electronic gauge station (flow) and upstream gauging stations
- 5.3 minimum once daily reading of precipitation gauges in Crowe Valley watershed
- 5.4 weekly back up and archiving of data from gauging network
- 5.5 completion of the Crowe River Flood Forecasting Model as required

5.6 completion of snow sampling as required (a minimum of once each winter month and twice per month starting in March)

The second stage, Flood Watch will be implemented when the flow in the Crowe River is **greater** than 150 cms (or as deemed necessary) as recorded at the Crowe River – Marmora Flow Gauge and will be utilized to indicate an increased risk of flooding and a notice to Municipalities that the potential for flooding has increased. <u>No</u> immediate action is required. A Flood Watch Statement is merely intended to increase awareness of the potential for flooding. Flood Watch will consist of all of the above plus the following:

5.7 fax or email an alert notice to Municipal Flood Coordinators

A sample of Flood Watch has been appended to this document.

A Flood Warning will be issued at the first indications that flooding is imminent. Imminent flooding is defined as "any change in river conditions which reasonably may be considered to be a threat to personal safety or cause extensive property damage". A sample Flood Warning has been appended to this document.

In the event that a Flood Warning is required the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority will immediately:

- 5.8 contact the Ontario Provincial Police and the Flood Coordinators of the three Municipalities and advise of a Flood Warning
- 5.9 advise the Provincial Emergency Response Coordinator (PERC) and the Media

At this point all agencies will proceed to implementation of the Flood Response Plan.

# 6.0 Flood Response Plan

Should a flood event occur the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority will:

- 6.1 organize a site meeting for municipal flood coordinators and the Ontario Provincial Police
- 6.2 continue to provide up to date reports regarding water level conditions, upstream water conditions, flood predictions and weather
- 6.3 act as a liaison with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans regarding flood and environmental concerns

At the Site Meeting the **Lead Municipalities** will assume joint responsibility for all flood response issues, including:

- 6.4 identifying residences and/or people at risk
- 6.5 issuing evacuation orders (in consultation with Ontario Provincial Police)
- 6.6 issuing of sand and sandbags to residents
- 6.7 coordinating resources with Municipal agencies (public utilities, shelter. Etc.)
- 6.8 declaration of an emergency (in consultation with Ontario Provincial Police and the Conservation Authority)

At the Site Meeting the **Ontario Provincial Police** will assume responsibility for all site security measures and media relations:

- 6.9 site security (road closures, emergency vehicle access, etc.)
- 6.10 information to media (with support from Municipalities and Crowe Valley Conservation Authority)
- 6.11 consult with the Lead Municipalities regarding the need for the declaration of an emergency

# 7.0 Additional Information

Appended to this plan is a compilation of additional information, contact numbers and background information that may be of assistance during a flood event. The Flood Coordinators for Lead Municipalities will also utilize the Emergency Planning documents of their Municipalities as a resource during a flood event.

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


